

## Here is an example of what we do when we gather for worship

Call to worship	Christianity is based not on what we do for God, but on what He has done for us in Christ. Each week we need to start our gatherings reorienting ourselves to this truth.
Song of Praise	Christians have always sung together: what Christ has done for us connects deeply with our hearts such that we love to sing His praises.
Prayer of Adoration & Confession	We bring our praise to God for who He is and we acknowledge our need of Him as people who fall short of His glory, asking for forgiveness and receive assurance of His grace through Jesus.
Scripture Reading	We believe the Bible to be the Word of God, and so give a portion of our time together to hearing the Bible read and then explained to us. We have Bibles available which can be found at your seat, but we also encourage people to bring a copy of their own.
Kids' Spot with Song	We believe as a church that children should attend public worship. The children's message sends an audio and visual message to children: you are an integral part of this church family. They will learn how to worship by watching others worship. During this time, we invite all children from nursery to primary 7 to come forward to the front to hear a message pitched at their level. It helps children (and the rest of us) come to a deeper understanding of God, His love, the Bible, the church, and God's world.
Offering / Giving	This is an opportunity for us to reflect on all that God has given to us, and how we can give back to His work in the church. If you're new to Muckamore, please feel no obligation to give. For regular attenders and members, we invite you to consider your offerings at this time.
Prayers for Others	Through His death and resurrection for us, Jesus has opened up access to God, so that we can bring Him all our concerns – for ourselves, others, the church, and the world – trusting in His purposes.
Song of Preparation	
Sermon	The sermon is teaching based on Scripture, designed to make the truths of the gospel real to our hearts as we see more of who Christ is and what He has done for us.
Song of Response	
Benediction	The benediction is how we close our time of gathered worship. It is a blessing from God to help us go into the world carrying the hope, joy and love of Jesus.

\* We also celebrate two sacraments on numerous occasions throughout the year. Baptism and the Lord's Supper are visible signs and seals of God's grace promised to His people in the gospel. The emphasis falls upon what God has done for sinners in the person of Jesus.
